Application Procedures

Interviews and Auditions will be held over a two day period in Miami on June 24 and 25, 1990. Be prepared to stay for two days. (All travel and lodging cost assumed by candidate). If you will be in the Miami area prior to June 24 and 25, you may arrange for an audition/interview at that time.

Applicants should have a solid foundation of academic and personal maturity to be considered for the program. The following materials should be submitted with the application form:

- 1. Proof of Bachelor's degree in theatre or equivalent education. (Provide a copy of transcript or degree).
- 2. Current resume of all theatrical training and experience.
- 3. Written statement of professional goals and intentions.
- 4. Three letters of recommendation (preferably from faculty or theatrical advisors).
- 5. Current headshot.
- 6. Application fee of \$35.00.

Acting - must prepare a one minute contemporary monologue and sixteen bars of a ballad. Bring dance attire.

Stage Management and Technical Theatre - must arrange for interview.

Playwriting - must submit a full-length play (which has been produced at least at university level) and other writing samples in addition to standard submission materials listed above; also must arrange for interview.

Directing - must submit letters of recommendation from supervising directors (may be from academic, community and professional theatres). In addition to standard submission materials listed above, also must arrange for interview. Upon receipt of the formal application materials candidate will be sent additional audition/interview requirements.

Administration - must arrange for an interview.

Professional Apprenticeship Program

designed for people with formal training
in theatre who want to advance beyond
the academic and are looking to develop
their artistic maturity. Unique in the
country, this body of experiences, in an

The Apprenticeship Program aims to be a true laboratory of creativity. It is not designed to teach basic skills, nor is it intended to take the place of a professional career situation. It is meant for exceptional students who have a solid foundation and now want to reach further, to see how far their skills and vision can take them.

Apprentices will work and train with the resident professional staff in addition to guest artists. They will attend seminars with noted mainstage directors and nationally recognized creative teams in such areas as set, light, and costume design. There will be intensive laboratory work, performing, directing, writing and teaching opportunities, master classes, classes in text analysis, and a wide variety of creative projects.


Apprentices can be called upon to write and direct and will perform as members of the In-School Touring Program. They will work on productions designed for many different groups, from high school students to special projects for elementary and exceptional children.

Apprenticeships are available in the following categories: Acting, Stage Management and Technical Theatre, Playwriting, Directing and Administration. Since space is limited, only those applicants whose training, auditions, samples of works and letters of recommendations are outstanding will be accepted.
